

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Matt. 5:19, "Whoever therefore breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven."



Gehenna, The Valley of Hinnom

11× in 10 verses

Where Judah sinned by committing child sacrifice and burning their sons and daughters in the fires of Molech. Thus this symbolized a place of idolatry, disobedience to God, and spiritual failure.



Gehenna, The Valley of Hinnom

ביא הַנֹם (ge'hinnom), γέεννα (geenna)
OT: 11× in 10 verses

The Valley of Hinnom was not used in the Old Testament as a reference to eternal condemnation in the Lake of Fire, but as a place of Divine discipline on the nation of Israel for their spiritual failure. It thus became a symbol for spiritual failure, condemnation and shame, and Divine discipline.

1 John 2:16, "For all that is in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the world."

Ezek. 6:9, "Then those of you who escape will remember Me among the nations where they are carried captive, because I was crushed by their adulterous heart which has departed from Me, and by their eyes which play the harlot after their idols; they will loathe themselves for the evils which they committed in all their abominations."

Job 31:1, "I have made a covenant with my eyes; Why then should I look upon a young woman?"

Matt. 5:30, "And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into the Valley of Hinnom."

Matt. 5:31, "Furthermore it has been said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.'

Matt. 5:32, "But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife for any reason except sexual immorality causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery."

Deut. 24:1, "When a man takes a wife and marries her, and it happens that she finds no favor in his eyes because he has found some uncleanness in her, and he writes her a certificate of divorce, puts it in her hand, and sends her out of his house,

Deut. 24:2, "when she has departed from his house, and goes and becomes another man's wife,"

Deut. 24:3, "if the latter husband detests her and writes her a certificate of divorce, puts it in her hand, and sends her out of his house, or if the latter husband dies who took her as his wife,

Deut. 24:4, "then her former husband who divorced her must not take her back to be his wife after she has been defiled; for that is an abomination before the LORD, and you shall not bring sin on the land which the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance."

Matt. 5:32, "But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife for any reason except sexual immorality causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery."

πορνεία *porneia* "sexual immorality"

Matt. 19:9, "And I say to you, whoever divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another, commits adultery; and whoever marries her who is divorced commits adultery."

1. In the gospel passages Jesus is addressing the problem of superficial application of the Law by the Pharisees in the matter of divorce. He is not giving an exhaustive discourse on marriage and divorce.

2. He is addressing the problem common to the history of mankind which is to minimize the lifetime monogamous commitment between one man and one woman to make divorce and remarriage more convenient.

3. In Jesus' teaching here and in Matt. 19:3–9 Jesus clearly affirms that the standard of God is a lifetime monogamous commitment.

4. However, the exception clause recognizes the realities of sin. I believe that based on Jesus' teaching here and Paul's teaching in 1 Corinthians 7:8-14; 27-28 that divorce is permissible for several reasons, including sexual sins, desertion, abuse, some forms of criminality.
