
Matthew Series Lesson #060 December 7, 2014

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Matt. 10:24, "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a servant above his master.

Matt. 10:25a, "It is enough for a disciple that he be like his teacher, and a servant like his master."

#### 2 Tim. 3:12, "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution."

If something is true for something greater, then it would by inference also be true for something lesser within the category. 2 Kings 1:2, "Now Ahaziah fell through the lattice of his upper room in Samaria, and was injured; so he sent messengers and said to them, 'Go, inquire of <u>Baal-zebub</u>, the god of Ekron, whether I shall recover from this injury'."

Baal-zebub "lord of the flies" Baal-zebul: a play on words, "lord of the dung" Matt. 12:24, "Now when the Pharisees heard it they said, 'This fellow does not cast out demons except by <u>Beelzebub, the ruler of the demons</u>'.

Matt. 12:25, "But Jesus knew their thoughts, and said to them: 'Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself will not stand.'

Matt. 12:26, "If Satan casts out Satan, he is divided against himself. How then will his kingdom stand?
