

ύπάρχω huparchō present active participle anarthrous adverbial concessive participle, "although <u>He</u> existed eternally"

μορφή morphē "form, outward appearance, shape or expression; used of <u>the nature</u> or essence of something"

Phil 2:6, "who, although He existed in the form of God, did not <u>regard</u> equality with God a thing to be grasped,"

WHO (Lord Jesus Christ) although He eternally existed with identical essence to God did NOT think

Is this thinking, this mental attitude, part of His Deity ... or His humanity?

Phil 2:6, "who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped,"

ἁρπαγμός *harpagmos*accusative masculine singular
"grasp, seize, snatched"
1. a violent seizure of property, robbery

2. equivalent to *harpagma*, someth. to which one can claim or assert title by gripping or grasping WHO (Lord Jesus Christ) although He eternally existed with identical essence to God did NOT think EQUALITY WITH GOD A CLAIM TO BE SELFISHLY GRASPED AFTER

ἀλλά; alla, "But," strong contrastive conjunction

κενόω kenoō, aorist active indicative 3S "to make empty, to empty, to render void"

Christ performed the action on Himself

ἑαυτοῦ; heautou, reflexive pron. accusative masculine 3S

"Himself"

λαμβάνω *lambanō*Aor act part masc sing nom to take, receive, choose;
an adverbial ptcp of means.
"By MEANS of receiving..."

HE EMPTIED HIMSELF <u>BY RECEIVING</u> THE FORM OF A SERVANT

Philippians 2:7, "but emptied Himself, [by] taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men."

μορφή *morphē* "form, outward appearance, shape or expression; used of the nature, essence of something" cf. vs. 6

δούλος *doulos* Noun gen masc sing slave; slavish, servile <u>Phil 2:6</u>, "who, although He existed in <u>the</u> <u>essence of God</u>, did not <u>regard</u> equality with God a thing to be grasped,

γίνομαι *ginomai* aorist middle participle;

"To come into being, to come into existence."

"... And by means of coming into existence"

Contrast with His Deity which

"existed" eternally vs. 6

ὑμοίωμα homoiōma dat neut sing likeness, the essence of humanity

"by being found"

σχήμα schēma dat neut sing form, outward form "the generally recognized state or form in which someth. appears" Philippians 2:8, "Being found in appearance as a man, He <u>humbled</u> Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

ταπεινόω *tapeinoō* aor act indic 3 sing "to humble, to see oneself in proper relation to reality, to place under authority." Philippians 2:8, "Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by <u>becoming</u> obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

> γίνομαι ginomai participle aorist middle deponent nominative masculine singular

"he humbled himself by becoming obedient"

Phil 2:9, "For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name," <u>1 Pet. 2:21</u>, "For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps:

<u>1 Pet. 2:22,</u> "Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth;

<u>1 Pet. 2:23</u>, "who, when He was reviled, did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously;

<u>1 Pet. 2:24</u>, "who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live for righteousness—by whose stripes you were healed." <u>1 Pet. 4:1</u>, "Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin,

<u>1 Pet. 4:2</u>, "that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God." <u>2 Cor. 12:7</u>, "And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, <u>lest</u> <u>I be exalted</u> above measure.

<u>2 Cor. 12:8</u>, "Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me.

<u>2 Cor. 12:9</u>, "And He said to me, '<u>My grace</u> <u>is sufficient for you, for My strength is made</u> <u>perfect in weakness</u>.' Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me."
