Matt. 22:37, “Jesus said to him, ‘You shall love the LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.’”

4. Conclusion:

Matt. 22:40, “On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.”

Jesus’ statement in Matt. 7:12, called the Golden Rule, states it this way:

Matt. 7:12, “Therefore, whatever you want men to do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.”

5. Response:

Mark 12:32, “So the scribe said to Him, ‘Well said, Teacher. You have spoken the truth, for there is one God, and there is no other but He.

Mark 12:33, “ ‘And to love Him with all the heart, with all the understanding, with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love one’s neighbor as oneself, is more than all the whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.’ ”

Mark 12:34, “Now when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, He said to him, ‘You are not far from the kingdom of God.’ ”

- 5. Therefore, we must understand Divine Love if we are going to understand LOVE in any sense whatsoever.**

What is Divine Love?

1. The pattern, paradigm, picture for us of Divine Love is in the cross.

Rom 5:8, “But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died as a substitute for us.”

2. God's love for us is not based on our actions, character, successes, failures, morality, lack of morality, or any other human factor.

Thus it is without conditions on our part.

It is unconditional, undeserved, unmerited.

Therefore God's love for us is based exclusively on His character and has nothing to do with our character.

3. God's love for us was such that He devised a solution for our greatest problem: sin and separation from Him.

4. God's love for us involved His whole essence.

It was perfectly compatible with His other attributes.

Righteousness: the solution had to be consistent with His righteousness.

Justice: the solution had to solve the problem of His justice.

Omniscience: the solution was based on His knowledge of all things, all sins, all circumstances.

Omnipotence: God was able to solve the problem.

No sin is too great for the love, grace, and power of God.

5. God's love is also described as faithful and loyal to His covenants and His promises.

Deut. 7:9, “Therefore know that the LORD your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy for a thousand generations with those who love Him and keep His commandments;”

6. God's love is sufficient to solve the greatest problem we will ever face and solves whatever sin problems we face.

7. Personal love for God is our response toward God's initiating love.

8. Love for God is based on knowledge. Therefore we learn to love God by learning who He is and what He has done for us.

1 John 4:8, “He who does not love does not know God, for God is love.”

9. Love for God is first of all based on knowledge not emotion. It is not to be confused with sentiment, or even gratitude, though both may be present.

10. The metric for love for God is obedience.

1 John 5:2, “By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and keep His commandments.”

Deut. 5:10, “but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments.”

**John 14:15, “If you love Me, keep My
commandments.”**

John 14:21, “He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me. And he who loves Me will be loved by My Father, and I will love him and manifest Myself to him.”

John 14:22, “Judas (not Iscariot) said to Him, ‘Lord, how is it that You will manifest Yourself to us, and not to the world?’ ”
