

"The complex literary phenomena are probably best accounted for by two originally separate stories of a woman anointing Jesus, John being aware of elements of both but linking this story with the Bethany family in whom he had a special interest (John 11:1–45; 12:9–11)."

John 12:1, "Then, six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus was who had been dead, whom He had raised from the dead.

John 12:2, "There they made Him a supper; and Martha served, but Lazarus was one of those who sat at the table with Him.

John 12:3, "Then Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the oil." μύρου νάρδου πιστικης myrou nardou pistikes

The reaction from the disciples

Matt. 26:8, "But when His disciples saw it, they were indignant, saying, 'Why this waste?

Matt. 26:9, " 'For this fragrant oil might have been sold for much and given to the poor.' " Matt. 26:10, "But when Jesus was aware of it, He said to them, 'Why do you trouble the woman? For she has done a good work for Me.

Matt. 26:11, " 'For you have the poor with you always, but Me you do not have always.

Matt. 26:12, "'For in pouring this fragrant oil on My body, she did it for My burial.'"

Matt. 26:13, "Assuredly, I say to you, wherever this gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be told as a memorial to her." Matt. 26:14, "Then one of the twelve, called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests

Matt. 26:15, "and said, 'What are you willing to give me if I deliver Him to you?' And they counted out to him thirty pieces of silver.
