

# MUEL THE BATTLE IS THE LORD'S

DAVID: A MAN AFTER GOD'S HEART 1 SAMUEL 16:1–13

#### 1 Samuel



<u>Gen. 49:9</u>, "Judah is a lion's whelp; from the prey, my son, you have gone up. He bows down, he lies down as a lion; and as a lion, who shall rouse him?

<u>Gen. 49:10</u>, "The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, <u>until Shiloh comes</u>; and to Him shall be the obedience of the people." <u>Gen. 49:9</u>, "Judah is a lion's whelp; from the prey, my son, you have gone up. Throughout the last half of Samuel we will see this subtle contrast between the genuine humility of David and the arrogance of Saul and between the rebelliousness of Saul and the obedience and submission of David.

And the elders of the town trembled at his coming, and said, 'Do you come peaceably?'

<u>1 Sam. 16:5</u>, "And he said, 'Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the LORD. <u>Sanctify</u> yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice.' Then he <u>consecrated</u> Jesse and his sons, and invited them to the sacrifice."

<u>1 Sam. 16:7</u>, "But the LORD said to Samuel, 'Do not look at his appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the LORD does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.'" Isa. 55:8, "'For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways,' says the LORD.

Isa. 55:9, " 'For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are My ways higher than your ways, and My thoughts than your thoughts.' " <u>1 Sam. 16:8,</u> "So Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. And he said, 'Neither has the LORD chosen this one.'

<u>1 Sam. 16:10</u>, "Thus Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel. And Samuel said to Jesse, 'The LORD has not chosen these.' " <u>1 Sam. 16:11</u>, "And Samuel said to Jesse, 'Are all the young men here?' Then he said, 'There remains yet the youngest, and there he is, keeping the sheep.' And Samuel said to Jesse, 'Send and bring him. For we will not sit down till he comes here.'" <u>1 Sam. 16:12</u>, "So he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, with bright eyes, and good-looking. And the LORD said, 'Arise, anoint him; for this is the one!'" <u>1 Sam. 16:13</u>, "Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers; and the Spirit of the LORD <u>came</u> <u>upon</u> David from that day forward. So Samuel arose and went to Ramah."

## The Ministry of the Holy Spirit (HS) in the Old Testament

- Was limited to leaders in Israel: prophets, priests, writers of Scripture, a few kings, judges, the craftsmen who made the tabernacle.
- 2. The HS was given to empower them to fulfill their responsibilities. Exod. 31:3, 4
- The HS was taken from Saul, and might have been taken from David. 1 Sam. 16:14; Psa. 51:11
- 4. The HS was not given to empower their spiritual lives.
