Psalm 18 Theme

The Psalmist expresses his gratitude, joy, and praise for the Lord's miraculous deliverance by explaining the circumstances of his distress and the merciful response of God to his pleas for deliverance.

1189 chapters in the Bible 365 days in a year =

3.25 chapters per day

72 hours to read the Bible aloud = 4320 minutes

4320 / 365 = 11.8 minutes per day!

Psa. 18:1, "I will love You, O LORD, my strength."

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qal imperf 1 com sing to love deeply, to have compassion, mercy; 17× in the Old Testament

Deut. 13:17, "So none of the accursed things shall remain in your hand, that the LORD may turn from the fierceness of His anger and show you mercy, have compassion on you and multiply you, just as He swore to your fathers,"

Deut. 30:3, "that the LORD your God will bring you back from captivity, and have compassion on you, and gather you again from all the nations where the LORD your God has scattered you."

2 Kings 13:23, "But the LORD was gracious to them, had compassion on them, and regarded them, because of His covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and would not yet destroy them or cast them from His presence."

Isa. 30:18, "Therefore the LORD will wait, that He may be gracious to you; And therefore He will be exalted, that He may have mercy on you. For the LORD is a God of justice; Blessed are all those who wait for Him."

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strength
