- \* Larkin, Clarence. *Dispensational Truth, or "God's Plan and Purpose in the Ages"*. Philadelphia, PA: Clarence Larkin, 1918. An older work, but still has value. He builds a case for an old-earth, gap view, with which I disagree, and has some rather odd ideas about the great pyramid of Giza, but otherwise much of this work still has value. For an updated chart book though, I highly recommended

LaHaye, Tim, and Thomas Ice, *Charting the End Times: A Visual Guide to Understanding Bible Prophecy* (Tim LaHaye Prophecy Library), 2001. This comes with a CD which has all of the charts in it. Highly recommended.

- \*Ryrie, Charles Caldwell. *Dispensationalism*. Rev. and expanded. Chicago: Moody Publishers, 1995. If only one book is read, this should be it. Almost everything since its first publication in the sixties interacts with this foundational book.
- \*Showers, Renald E. *There Really Is a Difference! A Comparison of Covenant and Dispensational Theology*. Bellmawr, N.J.: Friends of Israel Gospel Ministry, 1990. Excellent, basic development of dispensationalism versus covenant Theology.
- \*Trahan, Kerry. *A Complete Guide to Understanding the Dispensationalism Controversy*. Port Neches, TX: Disciple of Jesus Ministries, Inc., 2007. This was Trahan's doctoral dissertation at Louisiana Baptist Seminary. Fairly extensive.

Sauer, Erich. *The Dawn of World Redemption*. Grand Rapids: Eerdmans, 1955. Old Testament biblical theology at its finest by a German dispensationalist.
