



Literal Hermeneutics The Laws of How to Study God's Word

We apply a consistently literal hermeneutic in every section of Scripture.

"Literal" means that we study the Bible in its historical context, analyze grammar, and pay attention to the kind of literature found in each section of scripture.

Emphasis on Greek and Hebrew Exegesis

We believe that teaching the Word of God from the original languages best builds up believers in the faith for fruitful service.

Therefore, Greek and Hebrew exegesis, that is, grammatical analysis of the original languages, is foundational to our equipping program.

The Sufficiency of Scripture

We embrace Scripture's complete adequacy, for in it God "has given us all things that pertain to life and godliness."

Thus we believe that the Word of God by itself is sufficient to prepare a person for a lifetime of effective ministry.

Distinct Theology

Because of a literal hermeneutic, we teach that in God's eternal plan there is a clear distinction between Israel and the Church.


Though we teach a well-defined theological system, we train students to construct sound theology for their congregations during a lifetime of ministry.

The Freeness of God's Grace

We hold fast to "true grace" (1 Peter 5:12)—God saves man by grace alone through faith alone in Jesus Christ alone apart from all works.

No works ever contribute anything to the free gift of forgiveness and eternal life, which one receives through faith in Jesus Christ. The absence of good works, however, will diminish one's eternal reward.
