

Book of Beginnings

2 Cor. 4:7 But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the surpassing greatness of the power may be of God and not from ourselves;





1. Birth (noun) usually used with a preposition. There is no noun for birth in Hebrew. Thus when you have to express the prepositional phrase, you use *mibeten*, “from the womb,” or *bebeten*, “in the womb.” One synonym is *miracham*, used in Psa. 22:10; 58:4

Job 1:21 He said,

**“Naked I came from my
mother’s womb,**

And naked I shall return there.

**The LORD gave and the LORD
has taken away.**

**Blessed be the name of the
LORD.”**

**Job 3:11 “Why did I not die at
birth,**

**Come forth from the womb and
expire?”**

**Job 10:19 'I should have been as
though I had not been,
Carried from womb to tomb.'**

**Psa. 22:9 Yet You are He who
brought me forth from the womb;
You made me trust *when* upon
my mother's breasts.**

**Psa. 22:10 Upon You I was cast
from birth;**

**You have been my God from
my mother's womb.**

**Psa. 58:3 The wicked are
estranged from the womb;
These who speak lies go
astray from birth.**

**Isa. 44:2 Thus says the LORD who
made you**

**And formed you from the
womb, who will help you,**

**‘Do not fear, O Jacob My
servant;**

**And you Jeshurun whom I
have chosen.’**

**Isa. 44:24 Thus says the LORD,
your Redeemer, and the one who
formed you from the womb,
“I, the LORD, am the maker of
all things,
Stretching out the heavens by
Myself
And spreading out the earth all
alone,”**

Birth (verb) *yalad*

2. Conceive (verb) *harah*

Gen. 4:1 Now the man had relations with his wife Eve, and she conceived and gave birth to Cain, and she said, “I have gotten a manchild with *the help* of the LORD.”



harah

Gen. 4:17 Cain had relations with his wife and she conceived, and gave birth to Enoch; and he built a city, and called the name of the city Enoch, after the name of his son.

**Job 14:1 “Man, who is born of
woman,
Is short-lived and full of
turmoil.”**

**Job 15:14 “What is man, that he
should be pure,**

**Or he who is born of a woman,
that he should be righteous?”**

**Job 38:21 “You know, for you were
born then,**

**And the number of your days
is great!”**
