- 1. To encourage believers in the midst of opposition and persecution that God controls history.
- 2. To challenge believers with the future goal for the Church Age believer: to reign with Christ.
- 3. To provide information for the Tribulation saint to persevere during those unimaginably dark days.
- 4. To be a model for the worship of the Lamb, the Lamb who was slain for our sins, and who will return in victory as the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

Revelation 1:9 "I, John, both your brother and companion in the tribulation and kingdom and patience of Jesus Christ, was on the island that is called Patmos for the word of God and for the testimony of Jesus Christ." Revelation 1:10 "I was in the Spirit on the Lord's Day, and I heard behind me a loud voice, as of a trumpet,"

FOUR THINGS TO REMEMBER

- 1. The problem: who is qualified to judge
