Heb. 11:1, “Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

Heb. 11:2, “For by it the elders obtained a good testimony.”

- 1. Faith is a present certainty based on the conviction of a future expectation. So Faith is a confident assurance in a future reality.**
- 2. So faith puts its confidence in the revelation or the witness of the authority of God.**

Expanded Translation:

And none of these who trusted God received the promise yet, even though what they believed was confirmed by their actions.
