Parenthetical explanation

said, “I am exceedingly afraid and trembling.”)**

to the general assembly and church of the firstborn


who are registered in heaven,

to God the Judge of all,


to the spirits of just men made perfect,

to Jesus the Mediator of the new covenant,


**and to the blood of sprinkling that speaks better things than that


Heb. 12:18, “For you have not come to the mountain that may be touched and that burned with fire, and to blackness and darkness and tempest,”

Ex. 4:22, “Then you shall say to Pharaoh, ‘Thus says the LORD: “Israel is My son, My firstborn”.’ ”






Ex. 15:13, “You in Your mercy have led forth the people whom You have redeemed; You have guided them in Your strength to Your holy habitation.”
