# The Acts of the Apostles

## “To the end of the earth”

### Acts 1:8



## Literal Prophecy–Literal Fulfillment

**Matt. 2:5, “So they said to him, ‘In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it is written by the prophet:**

**Matt. 2:6, “ ‘But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are not the least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you shall come a Ruler who will shepherd My people Israel.’ ”**

**Mic. 5:2, “But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of you shall come forth to Me the One to be Ruler in Israel, whose goings forth are from of old [*qedem*], from everlasting [*‘olam*].”**

## **Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment**

**Matt. 2:15, “and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, ‘Out of Egypt I called My Son.’ ”**

**Hos. 11:1, “When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son.”**

## **Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment**

**Num. 24:7, “He shall pour water from his buckets, and his seed shall be in many waters. ‘His king shall be higher than Gog [not Agag], and his kingdom shall be exalted.’**

**Num. 24:8, “God brings him out of Egypt; He has strength like a wild ox; He shall consume the nations, his enemies; He shall break their bones and pierce them with his arrows.”**

# **Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment**

**Num. 24:9, “He bows down, he lies down as a lion; and as a lion, who shall rouse him? Blessed is he who blesses you, and cursed is he who curses you.”**

**Gen. 12:2; Gen. 49:10**

## **Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment**

**Matt. 2:15, “and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, ‘Out of Egypt I called My Son.’ ”**

**Hos. 11:1, “When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called My son.”**

# **Literal Historical Event–Typological Fulfillment**

**Matt. 15:7, “Hypocrites! Well did Isaiah prophesy about you, saying:**

**Matt. 15:8, “ ‘These people draw near to Me with their mouth, and honor Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me.**

**Matt. 15:9, “ ‘And in vain they worship Me, teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.’ ”**

**Isa. 29:13, “Therefore the Lord said: ‘Inasmuch as these people draw near with their mouths and honor Me with their lips, but have removed their hearts far from Me, and their fear toward Me is taught by the commandment of men,’ ”**

## **Literal History–Application**

**Matt. 2:17, “Then was fulfilled what was spoken by Jeremiah the prophet, saying:**

**Matt. 2:18, “ ‘A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation, weeping, and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted, because they are no more.’ ”**

**Jer. 31:15, “Thus says the LORD: ‘A voice was heard in Ramah, lamentation and bitter weeping, Rachel weeping for her children, refusing to be comforted for her children, because they are no more.’ ”**

**Midrash Rabbah 63:11, “Hence it is written as in the verse, and I will no more make you a reproach of famine among the nations.”**

# Summary

**Matt. 2:23, “And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, ‘He shall be called a Nazarene.’ ”**

**Acts 1:15, “And in those days Peter stood up in the midst of the disciples (altogether the number of names was about a hundred and twenty), and said,**

**Acts 1:16, “ ‘Men and brethren, this Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke before by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus;**

**Acts 1:17, “ ‘for he was numbered with us and obtained a part in this ministry.’ ”**

**Psa. 41:9, “Even my own familiar friend in whom I trusted, who ate my bread, has lifted up *his* heel against me.”**

**Acts 1:18, “(Now this man purchased a field with the wages of iniquity; and falling headlong, he burst open in the middle and all his entrails gushed out.**

**Acts 1:19, “And it became known to all those dwelling in Jerusalem; so that field is called in their own language, Akel Dama, that is, Field of Blood).” cf., Matt. 27:1–10**

**Zech. 11:12, “Then I said to them, ‘If it is agreeable to you, give me my wages; and if not, refrain.’ So they weighed out for my wages thirty pieces of silver.**

**Zech. 11:13, “And the LORD said to me, ‘Throw it to the potter’—that princely price they set on me. So I took the thirty pieces of silver and threw them into the house of the LORD for the potter.”**

**Matt. 27:3, “Then Judas, His betrayer, seeing that He had been condemned, was remorseful and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders,**

**Matt. 27:4, “saying, ‘I have sinned by betraying innocent blood.’ And they said, ‘What is that to us? You see to it!’ ”**

**Matt. 27:5, “Then he threw down the pieces of silver in the temple and departed, and went and hanged himself.**

**Matt. 27:6, “But the chief priests took the silver pieces and said, ‘It is not lawful to put them into the treasury, because they are the price of blood’.”**

**Matt. 27:7, “And they consulted together and bought with them the potter’s field, to bury strangers in.**

**Matt. 27:8, “Therefore that field has been called the Field of Blood to this day.”**

**Acts 1:20, “For it is written in the Book of Psalms: ‘Let his dwelling place be desolate, and let no one live in it’; and, ‘Let another take his office.’ ”**

**John 2:17, “Then His disciples remembered that it was written, ‘Zeal for Your house has eaten Me up.’ ”**

**Psa. 69:9, “Because zeal for Your house has eaten me up, and the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me.”**

**John 15:25, “But this happened that the word might be fulfilled which is written in their law, ‘They hated Me without a cause.’ ”**

**Psa. 69:4, “Those who hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head; they are mighty who would destroy me, being my enemies wrongfully; though I have stolen nothing, I still must restore it.”**

**Rom. 15:3, “For even Christ did not please Himself; but as it is written, ‘The reproaches of those who reproached You fell on Me.’ ”**

**Psa. 69:9, “Because zeal for Your house has eaten me up, and the reproaches of those who reproach You have fallen on me.”**

**Rom. 11:9, “And David says: ‘Let their table become a snare and a trap, a stumbling block and a recompense to them.**

**Rom. 11:10, “ ‘Let their eyes be darkened, so that they do not see, and bow down their back always’.”**

**Psa. 69:22, “Let their table become a snare before them, and their well-being a trap.**

**Psa. 69:23, “Let their eyes be darkened, so that they do not see; and make their loins shake continually.”**

**Psa. 69:25, “Let their dwelling place be desolate; let no one live in their tents.”**

**Psa. 109:8, “Let his days be few, and let another take his office.”**

**Acts 1:21, “Therefore, of these men who have accompanied us all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us,**

**Acts 1:22, “beginning from the baptism of John to that day when He was taken up from us, one of these must become a witness with us of His resurrection.”**

**Acts 1:23, “And they appointed two, Joseph called Barsabas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias.**

**Acts 1:24, “And they prayed, and said, ‘Thou, Lord, which knowest the hearts of all men, shew whether of these two thou hast chosen,**

**Acts 1:25, “ ‘That he may take part of this ministry and apostleship, from which Judas by transgression fell, that he might go to his own place.’**

**Acts 1:26, “And they gave forth their lots; and the lot fell upon Matthias; and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.”**
