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The Acts of the Apostles "To the end of the earth" Acts 1:8

The Exaltation and Suffering of "My Servant" Acts 8:26–40; Isaiah 52:13–15



The Ethiopian, Isa. 53, and Evangelism

- 1. The Ethiopian already believes in the God of the Torah, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.
- 2. The Ethiopian already believes in the authority of the Hebrew Scriptures.
- 3. The Ethiopian already believes in the reality and veracity of biblical prophecy.
- 4. The Ethiopian believes in the validity of animal sacrifice.
- 5. The Ethiopian already accepts the need for a sacrifice for the forgiveness of sins.

The Ethiopian, Isa. 53, and Evangelism

- 6. The Ethiopian already believes in the need for redemption and atonement.
- 7. The Ethiopian already believes in the validity of substitutionary atonement.
- 8. God the Holy Spirit is already working in the life and thinking of the Ethiopian eunuch.
- 9. The Ethiopian already has a concept of a literal, human Messiah.
- 10. The Ethiopian is not yet informed about the incarnation of God the Son, Jesus' crucifixion, burial, and resurrection, and the fulfillment of the Isaiah prophecy.

Modern Unbelievers, Isa. 53, and Evangelism

- 1. Uncertain at best if there is a God.
- 2. If they have a concept of God, it is not the biblical, Creator God who is Righteous, Just, and Love, but a God who overlooks people's flaws and peccadilloes.
- 3. Few believe in the legitimacy of biblical prophecy.
- 4. They don't believe in sin, or total depravity.
- 5. They have no concept of the need for atonement for sin.

Modern Unbelievers, Isa. 53, and Evangelism

- 6. They either don't believe in substitutionary payment for sin, or reject it as utterly unfair.
- 7. They certainly don't believe animal sacrifice is a good thing.
- 8. They don't understand anything about the need for a substitutionary atonement.
- 9. They may not have God the Holy Spirit illuminating their minds to the truth of Scripture at that point.
- 10. Establishing the truth of many of these points may take time depending on where they are in their prior understanding.

1 Pet. 3:15, "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense [apologia a reasoned, organized rationale with evidence] to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear;"

1 Cor. 2:14, "But the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned." Isa. 52:13, "Behold, My Servant shall deal prudently; He shall be exalted and extolled and be very high.

Isa. 52:14, "Just as many were astonished at you, so His visage was marred more than any man, and His form more than the sons of men;

Isa. 52:15, "So shall He sprinkle many nations. Kings shall shut their mouths at Him; for what had not been told them they shall see, and what they had not heard they shall consider."

The Identity of the Servant?

- 1. A historical figure? Isaiah himself, Elijah, Hezekiah, a prophet
- 2. The nation/people of Israel?
- 3. The future Messiah?

According to Isaiah 52:14-15, God's Servant

- suffers for the people of Israel,
- and His blood will sprinkle many nations.
- Thus, He is the Savior of both the Jews and the Gentiles.

Isa. 40–48: The future deliverance of Israel

The first "song": Isa. 42:1–9

Isa. 49–55: The future Deliverer of Israel

The second "song": Isa. 49:1–13

Isa. 56-66 The future delivered of Israel

Who is the Servant?

Isa. 41:8, "But you, <u>Israel, are My servant</u>, Jacob whom I have chosen, the descendants of Abraham My friend.

Isa. 41:9, "You whom I have taken from the ends of the earth, and called from its farthest regions, and said to you, "You are My servant, I have chosen you and have not cast you away:"

Who is the Servant?

Isa. 44:2, "Thus says the LORD who made you and formed you from the womb, who will help you: 'Fear not, O Jacob My servant; and you, Jeshurun, whom I have chosen.'

Isa. 44:21, "Remember these, O Jacob, and Israel, <u>for you are My servant</u>; I have formed you, <u>you are My servant</u>; O Israel, you will not be forgotten by Me!"

However, Israel is too corrupt and sinful to be the Servant ...

Isa. 1:4, "Alas, <u>sinful nation</u>, a people <u>laden with iniquity</u>, a <u>brood of evildoers</u>, children who are <u>corrupters</u>! They have <u>forsaken the LORD</u>, they have provoked to anger the Holy One of Israel, they have <u>turned away backward</u>."

Isa. 29:10, "For the LORD has poured out on you the spirit of deep sleep, and has closed your eyes, namely, the prophets; and He has covered your heads, namely, the seers."

Isa. 48:1, "Hear this, O house of Jacob, who are called by the name of Israel, and have come forth from the wellsprings of Judah; who swear by the name of the LORD, and make mention of the God of Israel, but not in truth or in righteousness;"

Instead, only the Servant can deliver Israel ...

Isa. 52:9, "Break forth into joy, sing together, you waste places of Jerusalem! For the LORD has comforted His people, he has redeemed Jerusalem."

Isa. 42:7, "To open blind eyes, to bring out prisoners from the prison, those who sit in darkness from the prison house."

Isa. 53:11, "He shall see the labor of His soul, and be satisfied. By His knowledge My righteous Servant shall justify many, for He shall bear their iniquities."

The Branch of Yhwh, Isa. 4:2

The Branch of David, Jer. 23:5, 6

My Servant, the Branch, Zech. 3:8

The Man whose name is the Branch, Zech. 6:12

The Man, the Servant, the Son of David, the Son of God.
