**Love Your Neighbor; Self-Love;
Loving One Another
Matthew 22:39–40**

Matt. 22:39, “And the second is like it: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’”

Matt. 22:40, “On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.”

Matt. 22:37, “Jesus said to him, ‘You shall love the LORD YOUR GOD WITH ALL YOUR HEART, WITH ALL YOUR SOUL, AND WITH ALL YOUR MIND.

Matt. 22:38, “ ‘This is the first and great commandment.’ ”

4. Conclusion:

Matt. 22:40, “On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets.”

Jesus’ statement in Matt. 7:12, called the Golden Rule, states it this way:

Matt. 7:12, “Therefore, whatever you want men to do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.”

5. Response:

Mark 12:32, “So the scribe said to Him, ‘Well said, Teacher. You have spoken the truth, for there is one God, and there is no other but He.

Mark 12:33, “ ‘And to love Him with all the heart, with all the understanding, with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love one’s neighbor as oneself, is more than all the whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.’ ”

Mark 12:34, “Now when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, He said to him, ‘You are not far from the kingdom of God.’ ”

But after that no one dared question Him.
