

1 Pet. 1:22, "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, <u>love one</u> another fervently with a pure heart,"

άγνίζω hagnizō perf act part masc plur nom to purify, to cleanse **Grammar: The perfect** tense indicates a previous completed action in past time with results emphasized in the present

ἀγαπάω agapaō aor act impera 2 plur to love

John 17:17, "Sanctify them by Your truth."
Your word is truth."

άγιάζω *hagiazō* aor act impera 2 sing to sanctify

John 17:17, "Sanctify them by Your truth."
Your word is truth."

ἁγιάζω *hagiazō* aor act impera 2 sing to sanctify

John 17:19, "And for their sakes I <u>sanctify</u> Myself, that they also <u>may be sanctified</u> by the truth."

1 Pet. 1:22, "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart,"

Is this purification, Phase 1 positional? Or, Phase 2, experiential sanctification?

1 Pet. 1:22, "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart,

1 Pet. 1:23, "[because you have] having been born again, not of corruptible seed but incorruptible, through the word of God which lives and abides forever,"

ἀναγεννάω *anagennaō* perf pass part masc plur nom to beget again, cause to be born again

These verses speak of experiential cleansing, i.e., 1 John 1:9

James 4:8, "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners; and purify your hearts, you double-minded."

1 John 3:3, "And everyone who has this hope in Him purifies himself, just as He is pure."

But the perfect tense verb indicates past completed action, so that would suggest Phase 1 positional cleansing.

John 13:34, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another."

John 15:12, "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

John 15:17, "These things I command you, that you love one another."

1 Pet. 1:22, "Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart,

ἀνυπόκριτος anupokritos

acc fem sing (verbal) sincere, free from pretense or deceit

έκτενῶς *ektenōs* constantly, earnestly καθαρός *katharos* gen fem sing clean, pure

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ἄφθαρτος aphthartos gen fem sing imperishable, immortal, incorruptible φθαρτός phthartos gen fem sing perishable, corruptible

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Eph. 1:13, "In Him you also trusted, after you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in whom also, having believed, you were sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise,"

Phil. 2:16, "holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain."

Col. 1:5, "because of the hope which is laid up for you in heaven, of which you heard before in the word of the truth of the gospel,"

Col. 4:3; 1 Thess. 1:8; 2:13; 2 Thess. 3:1; 2 Tim. 2:9; 4:2; Titus 1:3; 2:5; Heb. 13:7; Jas. 1:21

Isa. 40:1, "'Comfort, yes, comfort My people!' Says your God.

Isa. 40:2, "Speak comfort to Jerusalem, and cry out to her, that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned; For she has received from the LORD'S hand double for all her sins."

Isa. 40:3, "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the LORD; Make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

Isa. 40:4, "'Every valley shall be exalted and every mountain and hill brought low; The crooked places shall be made straight and the rough places smooth;

Isa. 40:5, "'The glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together; For the mouth of the LORD has spoken.'"

Isa. 55:1, "Ho! Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; And you who have no money, Come, buy and eat. Yes, come, buy wine and milk without money and without price."

"Every leading thought here [in Isa. 40] fits in with what our author [of 1 Peter] has been saying. He too is addressing readers who are exiled ... and oppressed; and he has the same message for them, the contrast between the perishability of all mortal things (cf. φθαρτός in verses 18, 23) and the incorruptibility of the Christian inheritance and hope. ... The passage quoted is, therefore, the focal point of a much longer passage which must have been often present in the Apostle's mind."
