2 Sam. 5:5, "In Hebron he reigned over Judah seven years and six months, and in Jerusalem he reigned thirty-three years over all Israel and Judah.

2 Sam. 5:6, "And the king and his men went to Jerusalem against the Jebusites, the inhabitants of the land, who spoke to David, saying, 'You shall not come in here; but the blind and the lame will repel you,' thinking, 'David cannot come in here.'" <u>1 Chron. 11:4</u>, "And David and all Israel went to Jerusalem, which is Jebus, where the Jebusites were, the inhabitants of the land.

<u>1 Chron. 11:5,</u> "But the inhabitants of Jebus said to David, 'You shall not come in here!' Nevertheless David took the stronghold of Zion (that is, the City of David)." <u>1 Chron. 11:6</u>, "Now David said, 'Whoever attacks the Jebusites first shall be chief and captain.' And Joab the son of Zeruiah went up first, and became chief.

<u>1 Chron. 11:7</u>, "Then David dwelt in the stronghold; therefore they called it the City of David."

The Significance of Jerusalem




- Jerusalem, 669× Old Testament; 731× in entire Bible

- Jerusalem not mentioned in the Koran once

Psalm 78:68, "But [God] chose the tribe of Judah, Mount Zion which He loved."

Psalm 132:13, "For the LORD has chosen Zion; He has desired *it* for His dwelling place:"



Psa. 76:2, "In Salem also is His tabernacle [den, lair], and His dwelling place in Zion."



<u>Gen. 22:2,</u> "Then He said, 'Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you.'"

Therefore he called the name of that place Baal Perazim.
