

# Psa. 32:0, "A Psalm of David. A Contemplation. [A Maskil]

In Book 1 (Psa. 1–41) 37 are identified as psalms of David, but Psalm 2 is identified as David's in the New Testament.

Maskil is unknown, maybe a wisdom psalm, a contemplation, or didactic—used in 12 psalms.
