

Psa. 115:3, "But our God is in heaven; He does whatever He pleases."

Psa. 115:4, "Their idols are silver and gold, The work of men's hands.

Psa. 115:5, "They have mouths, but they do not speak; Eyes they have, but they do not see;

Psa. 115:6, "They have ears, but they do not hear; Noses they have, but they do not smell;

Psa. 115:7, "They have hands, but they do not handle; Feet they have, but they do not walk; Nor do they mutter through their throat.

Psa. 115:8, "Those who make them are like them; So is everyone who trusts in them."

Rom. 1:18, "For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,

<u>Rom. 1:19</u>, "because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them.


<u>Rom. 1:20,</u> "For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse," Rom. 1:21, "because, although they knew God, they did not glorify Him as God, nor were thankful, but became futile in their thoughts, and their foolish hearts were darkened.

<u>Rom. 1:22</u>, "Professing to be wise, they became fools,

Rom. 1:23, "and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man—and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things."

Acts 19:20, "So the word of the Lord grew mightily and prevailed."

Acts 19:24, "For a certain man named Demetrius, a silversmith, who made silver shrines of Diana, brought no small profit to the craftsmen."


