


The Ascension of Christ Ephesians 2:6; Mark 16:19–20; Luke 24:50–53; Acts 1:9

## The Ascension of Christ: Background




What happened to God's plan when the Lord Jesus Christ was rejected and crucified?

Acts 1:6, "Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, 'Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?'"

1. The Jews expected a "one-coming" Messiah.

2. Jews wanted the crown before the cross, the glorious Messiah before the suffering Messiah.

What, then, is the purpose for the ascension and the unforeseen interadvent age—the present Church Age?

John 16:7, "Nevertheless I tell you the truth. It is to your advantage that I go away; for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you; but if I depart, I will send Him to you."

Acts 1:7, "And He said to them, 'It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority.

Dan. 7:9, "I kept looking until thrones were set up, and the Ancient of Days took His seat; His vesture was like white snow and the hair of His head like pure wool. His throne was ablaze with flames, its wheels were a burning fire.

Dan. 7:10, "A river of fire was flowing and coming out from before Him; Thousands upon thousands were attending Him, and myriads upon myriads were standing before Him; The court sat, and the books were opened."

Dan. 7:13, "I kept looking in the night visions, and behold, with the clouds of heaven One like a Son of Man was coming, and He came up to the Ancient of Days and was presented before Him.

Dan. 7:14, "And to Him was given dominion, glory and a kingdom, that all the peoples, nations and men of every language might serve Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion which will not pass away; And His kingdom is one which will not be destroyed."

Acts 1:10, "And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel,"





1. The Ascension validated and certified Christ's prophecy that He would go to the Father.

John 14:28, "You heard that I said to you, 'I go away, and I will come to you.' If you loved Me, you would have rejoiced because I go to the Father, for the Father is greater than I."

2. The Ascension is pictured with passive voice verbs, indicating God the Father's acceptance and reception of His Son back in Glory in Heaven. (Mark 16:19; Luke 24:51; Acts 1:2, 9, 11, 22)

3. The Ascension is pictured as a Rapture and thus is a shadow or type of the future pre-Tribulation Rapture of the Church.

Revelation 12:5, "And she gave birth to a son, a male child, who is to rule all the nations with a rod of iron; and her child was caught up to God and to His throne."

4. The Ascension completes the strategic victory of Christ in the angelic conflict.

ONE: Crucifixion-Victory over the penalty of Sin—spiritual death TWO: Resurrection-Victory over consequences of sin—physical death THREE: Ascension-Victory over Satan and his demonic armies

5. The Ascension elevated a MAN to the right hand of God the Father and the command post of the universe.

Acts 2:32, "'This Jesus God raised up again, to which we are all witnesses.

Acts 2:33, "'Therefore having been exalted to the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured forth this which you both see and hear.'"

Acts 2:34, "For it was not David who ascended into heaven, but he himself says: 'THE LORD SAID TO MY LORD, "SIT AT MY RIGHT HAND,

Acts 2:35, " "UNTIL I MAKE YOUR ENEMIES A FOOTSTOOL FOR YOUR FEET." '"

## 6. The Ascension marks the beginning of Christ's High Priestly ministry.

Heb. 4:14, "Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession."

7. The Ascension demonstrates the manner of Christ's future Second Coming.

8. The Ascension transferred the Old Testament saints from Paradise to Heaven. (Eph. 4:9, 10)

- Jesus Christ sent the Holy Spirit to perform the following post-salvation ministries in the life of the Church Age believer.
  - Baptism by means of the Holy Spirit
  - Indwelling of the Holy Spirit
  - Filling by means of the Holy Spirit
  - Distribution of spiritual gifts

10. The Ascension marks the beginning of the waiting period for the Kingdom while a new people is formed related to His third royal title: King of Kings and Lord of Lords.
