

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Saved for Good Works Ephesians 2:10 Eph. 2:10, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them."

Initial Observations:

1. The verse begins with a "for" (γάρ, *gar*), indicating to us that this is further explanation or clarification of vss. 8, 9.

Verse 8 also began with a "for", to explain or clarify verses 1–7.

2. Eph. 2:10 is a contrast with vss. 8–9, which states that our "by grace through faith salvation" is not from works, states that it is for *the purpose* of good works.

Initial Observations:

3. Ephesians 2:10 moves us from PHASE 1 justification (Eph. 2:8–9) to Phase 2 sanctification.

Eph. 2:1, "And you [He made alive], who were dead in trespasses and sins,

Eph. 2:2, "in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience,

Eph. 2:3, "among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others.

Eph. 2:4, "But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us,

Eph. 2:5, "even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), Eph. 2:6, "and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, Eph. 2:7, "that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus."

Eph. 2:9, "not of works, lest anyone should boast.

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Eph. 2:10, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them."

Eph. 1:12, "that we who first trusted in Christ should be to the praise of His glory."

Eph. 2:11, "Therefore remember that v'all, once Gentiles in the flesh—who are called Uncircumcision by what is called the Circumcision made in the flesh by hands— Eph. 2:12, "that at that time v'all were without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. Eph. 2:13, "But now in Christ Jesus V'all who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. Eph. 2:14, "For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation,"

1st Person Plural: "we" "us" "our"

Jewish background believers who first believed in Christ.
Jewish and Gentile believers together in Christ.

2nd Person Plural: "you" "y'all"

Gentiles, believer or unbeliever.

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"made alive together" = being "saved" = regeneration (being born again)

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
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1. This salvation is "through faith", which means faith must precede salvation.


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Eph. 2:9, "not of works, lest anyone should boast."

διὰ πίστεως dia pistis through faith, belief trust



The spiritually dead sinner separated from the life of God, the water of life.



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- 3. The pronoun "that" is a neuter and must refer to a neuter noun.
- 4. "Grace" and "faith" are feminine nouns; "saved" is a masculine participle.
- 5. In Greek, neuter demonstrative pronouns are used to refer to phrases, clauses, sentences, and entire works of literature.

Eph. 2:8, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that 'by grace through faith salvation' is not of yourselves; it is the gift of God,

Eph. 2:9, "not of works, lest anyone should boast."

John 11:25, "Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live.

John 11:26, "'And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?'"

John 20:31, "but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name."

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Eph. 2:10, "For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them."

Rom. 4:3, "For what does the Scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness."

Eph. 2:13, "But now in Christ Jesus y'all who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ."
