

Eph. 2:16, "and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity [the Law]."

ἀποκαταλλάσσω apokatallaxē 3 sing aor act subj to reconcile; to restore peace or harmony between people, or between God and man. We are reconciled to God, He is not reconciled to us.




