

Eph. 2:14, "For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation,



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

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καταλλάσσω *katallassō* 1 plur aor pass indic to reconcile: to restore after a period of hostility

Rom. 5:10, "For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life."

"For if when we were enemies were restored to our previous position through our Lord Jesus Christ. Having been restored to our previous position of peace we shall be saved by His life." [paraphrase]

Rom. 5:11, "And not only that, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation."

- 2. We must receive the reconciliation, vs. 11




2 Cor. 5:20, "Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God."








Rom. 3:10, "As it is written: 'There is none righteous, no, not one;'"



Rom. 5:7, "For one will hardly die for a righteous man; though perhaps for the good man someone would dare even to die.


Rom. 5:8, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."

1 Cor. 15:3, "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures,"








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






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2 Corinthans 5:21, "He made Him who know no sin to be sin our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

Rom. 4:3, "For what does the Scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness.'


Rom. 4:4, "Now to him who works, the wages are not counted as grace but as debt.
