



The problem: we are born spiritually dead

Eph. 2:1, "And you were dead in your trespasses and sins,"

Temporal Realities

1. The Baptism of the Holy Spirit (BHS) is uniquely the work of the Holy Spirit for this present age.

Figuratively baptism represents identification with a new state.

Therefore BHS identification with Christ in His death, burial, and resurrection, our new position in Christ, and our new identity in Christ. 2. The BHS is the unique mark of the Church. Thus, all Church Age believers are baptized by the Holy Spirit.

3. The BHS is often confused with the indwelling of the Holy Spirit (HS) and the filling of the HS, but these are distinct ministries.

4. BHS occurs for every believer at the instant of salvation and is not experienced, it is only learned by studying the Bible.

1 Cor. 12:13, "For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit."

Matt. 3:11, "As for me, I baptize you with water for repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, and I am not fit to remove His sandals; He will baptize you by means of the Holy Spirit and fire."

so Jesus in the future will use the HS [en] to identify the new believer with His own death, burial, and resurrection and place the believer into the body of Christ and in Himself.

Acts 1:5, "for John baptized [act] with water [en hudati], but you will be baptized [future passive] by means of the Holy Spirit [en pneumati] not many days from now."

1 Cor. 12:13, "For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit."

Gal. 3:27, "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.

Gal. 3:28, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free man, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus."


Rom. 6:3, "Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?

Rom. 6:4, "Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

The baptism by means of the HS is the work of Christ whereby at the moment of faith alone in Christ alone, Christ uses the HS to identify the believer with the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. So that he becomes a new creature in Christ, where the power of the sin nature is broken, but the presence of the sin nature is not removed until death or the Rapture, whichever comes first.




1. Indwelling of God before the Church: Indwelling in the Old Testament

Gen. 2:8, "The LORD God planted a garden eastward in Eden, and there He put the man whom He had formed."

Gen. 3:8, "And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden."

Gen. 9:27, "May God enlarge Japheth, and may he <u>dwell</u> in the tents of Shem; And may Canaan be his servant."


