



περιπατέω peripateō aor act infin to walk, walk around, figurative for the Christian way of life

ἀξίως axiōs adverb: in a worthy manner; worthily, in a manner worthy of, suitably

3. "The noun κλῆσις 'calling' refers to the position of status, honor, and responsibility that God has entrusted to his saints. This calling is the same for all saints, despite the diversity of the spiritual gifts they are given, therefore in biblical diction this noun is never used in the plural." ~M. Barth, Ephesians.

"Grace" is sometimes Paul's shorthand for grace gift (charis for charisma)

Examples of an appositional genitive

- 1) "the land of Egypt" (category-example) the land, which is Egypt
- 2) "the sign of circumcision" (ambiguity-clarification) the sign, which is circumcision
- 3) "the breastplate of righteousness" (metaphor-meaning), the breastplate, which is righteousness

Luke 22:1, "Now the Feast WHICH IS Unleavened Bread drew near, which is called Passover."

John 2:21, "But He was speaking of the temple WHICH IS His body."

Rom. 4:11, "And he received the sign WHICH IS circumcision,"

2 Pet. 2:6, "and turning the cities WHICH ARE Sodom and Gomorrah into ashes, condemned them to destruction, making them an example to those who afterward would live ungodly;"

Rev. 1:3, "Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words WHICH ARE this prophecy, and keep those things which are written in it; for the time is near."

Col. 1:18, "And He is the head of the body, WHICH IS the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence."
