- 1. At the instant of faith in Christ, every believer is “born again” or regenerated. (John 3:3–5; Titus 3:5)**
- 2. At that point we are a new creature in Christ. (2 Cor. 5:17)**
- 3. Jesus didn’t come to limit our lives, but to give an abundant life. (John 10:10)**
- 4. Abundant life is the result of our spiritual growth and maturation (1 Pet. 2:2)**

**Predestination (Gk. *proorízō*). The divine determination of human beings to eternal salvation or eternal damnation.

**Predestination (from Lat. '*praedestinare*', Vulgate translation of Greek. προορίζειν, 'foreordain'). The Divine decree according to which certain persons are infallibly guided to eternal salvation.

Predestination Divine and unalterable determination of the salvation or damnation of human beings even before they are created.

Predestination God's foreordination of persons to a particular end, most commonly to a particular eternal destiny and less commonly to a particular vocation or to a particular task.

NIDNTT: cl & ot The compound *prohorizoæ* (formed from *pro*, in front, before and *horizō*, to ordain, determine) is only used from the 4th century B.C. onwards (Demosthenes, 31, 4), and means *to preordain*. It is not found in the Septuagint (LXX).

“To prove that these statements of mine are true, that he even now declares that the land is mortgaged for a talent, but that he laid claim to two thousand drachmae more on the house, and took the pillars down after the suit was decided, I shall bring forward witnesses who know the facts.”

**“he (sc. the mortgagee) had the house marked with stones (v. “ὄρος” 11) as well to the amount of 2000 drachmae,”

ὀρίζω (*horizō*), determine, appoint; Heb. 4:7 ???

Romans 8:29: “Long ere this He knew our hearts, long ere this He claimed us (as a man claims property by setting his landmarks thereon) as those whom He should mould into the very likeness of His own Son,”

ὁρίζω (*horizō*), determine, appoint; Heb. 4:7

***horizō* is connected with *horos*, boundary, and *horion*, region. Originally it meant to set bounds, bound, and hence to establish, determine the boundaries or limitations, of something.**

Acts 17:26, “And He has made from one blood every nation of men to dwell on all the face of the earth, and has determined [established] their preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings,”

Acts 10:42, “And He commanded us to preach to the people, and to testify that it is He who was ordained [*appointed* ~HCSB] by God to be Judge of the living and the dead.”

Acts 17:31, “because He has appointed [*fixed* ~NET] a day on which He will judge the world in righteousness by the Man whom He has ordained [*appointed* ~NET, HCSB]. He has given assurance of this to all by raising Him from the dead.”

Romans 8:28, “And we know that to them that love God all things work together for good, even to them that are called according to his purpose.

Romans 8:29, “For whom he foreknew, he also foreordained [appoint beforehand] to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren:

Romans 8:30, “and whom he foreordained [appoint beforehand], them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified.” ~ASV

What has God set as the goal of our spiritual growth?

To be conformed to the character of His Son.

We are to be like Jesus Christ and not like *babies*.

***ἵνα hina* Conjunction or purpose or result:
that, in order that, so that**

***νήπιος nēpios*
masc plur nom (adj)
young; infant; child up to puberty.
However, the word was used as an insult or pejorative for acting like a baby, not acting one's age**

νήπιος nēpios used of childish, simple, foolish behavior of those who ought to know better

Prov. 1:32, “For the turning away of the simple will slay them, and the complacency of fools will destroy them;”

Rom. 2:20, “an instructor of the foolish, a teacher of babes, having the form of knowledge and truth in the law.”

1 Cor. 3:1, “And I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual [walking by the Spirit] people but as to fleshly, as to babes in Christ.”
