

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1. In Ephesians we have seen that a major theme is the emphasis on a corporate reality, the emphasis on the corporate nature of "the Church".

Eph. 2:14, "For He Himself is our peace, who has made both one, and has broken down the middle wall of separation, <u>Eph. 2:15, "having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the</u> law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace,

Eph. 2:16, "and that He might reconcile them both to God in one body through the cross, thereby putting to death the enmity."

Review

2. "We" emphasizes the joining together of Jewish and Gentile believers.

<u>Eph. 2:10</u>, "For we are His masterpiece, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them."



3. The problem in their experience was the lack of unity.

<u>Eph. 4:31</u>, "Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice. <u>Eph. 4:32</u>, "And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you."



In contrast to:

<u>Eph. 4:1,</u> "Therefore, I, the prisoner of the Lord, strongly urge you to conduct your life in a manner worthy of the exalted position to which you were summoned," ~RD amplified

Participles (Often -ing Words) and Verbs

A present tense verb + a present tense participle = action at the same time.

A present tense verb + a past tense participle = the action of the participle comes before the action of the verb.

A present tense verb + a future tense participle = the action of the participle comes after the action of the verb.

A past tense participle precedes the action of the main verb.

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The "body of sin" = the sin nature
