The believer trusts God to fulfill His promises, relies upon biblical principles, and thinks through doctrinal rationales, resulting in a relaxed mental attitude because God is taking care of the situation.

- Grab a verse or part of a verse
- Mix it with faith, trusting in God
- Do what it says to do (mental attitude, communication, behavior)
- Relax in God's provision and oversight

- Conforming or aligning our thinking toward people, situations, and events with God's grace policy.
- Grace means that God has freely given us everything we need on the basis of who He is and what Christ did on the cross.
- Grace orientation involves humility, is the basis for loving others, treat others in kindness and graciousness, and also involves the development of our spiritual gifts (grace gifts).

- Grace means that God has already freely given to us advance to spiritual maturity.

Three areas of Grace

1. Grace before salvation: Common grace

Matt. 5:45, "that you may be sons of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust."

Three areas of Grace

2. Grace at salvation: the sufficiency of the cross

<u>Eph. 2:8,</u> "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, <u>Eph. 2:9,</u> "not of works, lest anyone should boast."

John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

3. Grace after salvation: the sufficiency of Scripture, the sufficiency of grace
