
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

Women trend toward wanting to be the leader

Solution: Submit to the leadership of the husband

General trend of men

Both reflect the core arrogant, "me first," orientation of the sin nature.

The one and only acceptable starting point for defining love is the Bible and what the Bible says about God's love.

<u>1 John 4:16, "... God is love."</u>

God who loves.

Deut. 7:7, "The LORD did not set His <u>love</u> on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any other people, for you were the least of all peoples;"

1. The Old Testament (OT) speaks of God's love in terms that emphasize God's loyalty and faithfulness to His promises, especially to His people. A love not based on any merit in the object of love, but on the integrity of

Deut. 7:7, "The LORD did not set His love on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any other people, for you were the least of all peoples; He would keep the oath which He swore to your fathers, the LORD has brought you out with a mighty hand, and of Pharaoh king of Egypt. His commandments;"

- **Deut. 7:8**, "but because the LORD loves you, and <u>because</u> redeemed you from the house of bondage, from the hand

4. The mandate to the husband is an emphatic, specific reminder to him of the mandate to all believers to love one another, especially your wife.

John 15:12, "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.

John 15:13, "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends."

John 15:17, "These things I command you, that you love one another."

<u>Gal. 5:22, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace,</u> longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

<u>Gal. 5:23, "gentleness, self-control. Against such there</u> is no law."

5. This love expected of a Christian husband is impossible. It is only accomplished through the fruit of the Spirit.
