

- Eph. 6:10, "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might.
- Eph. 6:11, "Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.
- Eph. 6:12, "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places.


Ezek. 28:13, "'"'You were in Eden, the garden of God; Every precious stone was your covering: The sardius, topaz, and diamond, beryl, onyx, and jasper, sapphire, turquoise, and emerald with gold. The workmanship of your timbrels and pipes was prepared for you on the day you were created.

Ezek. 28:14, "'"'You were the anointed cherub who covers; I established you; You were on the holy mountain of God; You walked back and forth in the midst of fiery stones.

Satan the Tempter

Matt. 4:1, "Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

2 Cor. 11:3, "But I fear, lest somehow, as the serpent deceived Eve by his craftiness, so your minds may be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ."

Rev. 12:9, "So the great dragon was cast out, that serpent of old, called the Devil and Satan, who deceives the whole world; he was cast to the earth, and his angels were cast out with him."

Lev. 17:7, "They shall no more offer their sacrifices to demons, after whom they have played the harlot. This shall be a statute forever for them throughout their generations."

<u>Deut. 32:17</u>, "They <u>sacrificed to demons</u>, not to God, <u>to gods</u> they did not know, to new gods, new arrivals that your fathers did not fear."

2 Chron. 11:15, "Then he [Jereboam I] appointed for himself priests for the high places, for the demons, and the calf idols which he had made."

Psa. 106:37, "They even sacrificed their sons and their daughters to <u>demons</u>,"

This is the roots of antisemitism: the strategy of the devil to destroy the descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob to prevent God from fulfilling His covenant with them.

Job 1:8, "Then the LORD said to Satan, 'Have you considered My servant Job, that there is none like him on the earth, a blameless and upright man, one who fears God and shuns evil?'

Job 1:9, "So Satan answered the LORD and said, 'Does Job fear God for nothing?'"

Job 1:12, "And the LORD said to Satan, 'Behold, all that he has is in your power; only do not lay a hand on his person.' So Satan went out from the presence of the LORD."

What we have learned:

- 1. Satan and the demons have targeted the human race since our creation to use us in a vain attempt to prove Satan's ability to govern God's creation.
- 2. All of the horrors of crime, war, rebellions, murders, terrorism, famines, natural disasters, etc. demonstrate their inability to rule God's creation.
- 3. God punishes evil in His own time.
- 4. Satan and the demons have great powers but can only use them under God's authority.

What we have learned:
