Guard Against False Teachers

2 Pet. 1:3, “Since His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to *our* [physical] life and spiritual life, through the knowledge [*epignosis*] of Him who called us by glory and virtue,” ~RD

2 Pet. 2:20, “For if, after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled in them and overcome, the latter end is worse for them than the beginning.”

Jude 12–13, “These are spots in your love feasts, while they feast with you without fear, serving only themselves. They are clouds without water, carried about by the winds; late autumn trees without fruit, twice dead, pulled up by the roots; raging waves of the sea, foaming up their own shame; wandering stars for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever.”

Eph. 2:1, “And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins,”

Col. 2:13, “And you, being dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses,”

Sorites

Peter presents his virtue list by using a literary device, fashionable during the period, called sorite (or climax, ladder; gradatio, gradation).

to virtue knowledge,”**
