

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Reaching for the Goal Philippians 3:12–14



In Php. 3 the focus is on standing firm against error.

Two sources:

1. Stephanos—the victor's crown: a crown given as an Jesus' head.

award for successful achievement, for victory in the Olympic games, bravery in combat or a place of honor at a feast. The stephanos is given for achievement or merit. This is the term used to describe the crown of thorns on

2. *Diadema*—the royal crown: describes a crown used for a king. DIADEMA is not used for the believer's rewards in the Bible.

As believers we are not to live our Christian lives aimlessly, but toward the goal of winning the prize.

<u>1 Cor. 9:26, "Therefore I run thus: not with uncertainty.</u> Thus I fight: not as one who beats the air."

δέρω (*der* \bar{o}), beat, flay

<u>1 Cor. 9:27, "But I discipline my body and bring *it* into</u> subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified."

νπωπιάζω hypōpiazō to strike, treat roughly, maltreat



<u>1 Cor. 9:27</u>, "But I discipline my body and bring *it* into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become <u>disqualified</u>."

ἀδόκιμος *adókimos* Unapproved, <u>unworthy</u>, <u>unqualified</u>, worthless, unacceptable spurious. Used of the athlete who failed in the 10 months of training, or he failed to win.

<u>1 Cor. 9:27</u>, "But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become <u>disqualified</u>."

ἀδόκιμος *adokimos* masc sin unacceptable

<u>1 Cor. 3:13,</u> "each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will <u>test [qualify]</u> each one's work, of what sort it is."

For What Did Christ Lay Hold of Us?

- **1. For eternal life with Him,**
- 2. For the excellence of the knowledge of Christ (Php. 3:8, 10), 3. Having the righteousness which is from God through faith
- (Php. 3:9),
- 4. To know the power of His resurrection (Php. 3:10),
- 5. To know the partnership with His sufferings (Php. 3:10b),
- 6. To attain to the Rapture either before or after he died physically, he wasn't sure (Php. 3:11),
- 7. Attaining eternal rewards (Php. 3:13–14),
- 8. Paul sets these as Christ's goal for him and us, not the legalistic goals of the Judaizers.

9. To be transformed (Rom. 12:2) and conformed to the character of Christ (Rom. 8:29).

<u>Rom. 8:29, "For whom He foreknew, He also pre-</u> <u>Son, that He might be the firstborn among many</u> brethren."

In Ephesians Lesson 17:

"... we know that He brings together for good all things, for those who love God and are called according to His purpose. For God knew His own before creation, and also pre-appointed them, that they should be spiritually shaped in the character of His Son, that He might be the first-born among a large family of brothers; and it is these, so appointed beforehand, whom He has also called...." [Rom. 8:28–29, ~RD]

10. We are laid hold of to focus on Christ.

<u>Heb. 12:2</u>, "looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

Occupation with Christ: we love Christ and His mission for us more than we love our own lives.

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
