
Psa. 104:6, "You covered it with the deep as with a garment; The waters stood above the mountains.

Gen. 4:19, "Then Lamech took for himself two wives: the name of one was Adah, and the name of the second was Zillah.


Gen. 4:20, "And Adah bore Jabal. He was the father of those who dwell in tents and have livestock.

Gen. 4:21, "His brother's name was Jubal. He was the father of all those who play the harp and flute.



Gen. 5:4, "After he begot Seth, the days of Adam were eight hundred years; and he had sons and daughters."









Modern map of Antarctica


Oronteus Fineaus Map













Growing glaciers created "roads" for migration.

<u>Job 30:4</u>, "Who pluck mallow by the bushes, and broom tree roots for their food.


<u>Job 30:5</u>, "They were driven out from among men, they shouted at them as at a thief.

<u>Job 30:6</u>, "They had to live in the clefts of the valleys, in caves of the earth and the rocks.


