## To understand the meaning of a word, we need to know the context

## Question: Why are there three different meanings?

# Answer: This is because the salvation that Yahweh promises comes in three different parts.

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#### 1. Saved from the Penalty of Sin: Justification

### a. What happens when a person puts his faith in Jesus?





### God justifies believers (saves us from the penalty of sin) because of what Jesus did

#### man: unrighteous

#### Jesus paid the sin penalty of death for man's sin

The penalty for sin is death



### Eternal destiny

#### man: righteous

#### Jesus lived a perfect life by God's righteous standards

#### **Based on what Jesus** did for mankind



**Eternal** destiny













#### <u>2 Cor. 5:21</u>, "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

<u>Rom. 5:17, "For if by the one man's offense death reigned</u> through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ.) Rom. 5:18, "Therefore, as through one man's offense judgment came to all men, resulting in condemnation, even so through one Man's righteous act the free gift came to all men, resulting in justification of life."

#### ii. Yahweh transfers believers out of the "in Adam" group and places us into the "in Christ" group.

### **<u>Col. 1:13</u>**, "He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, **<u>Col. 1:14</u>**, "in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins."

## b. When do believers become saved from the penalty of sin?

### <u>Rom. 5:2</u>, "through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." <u>Eph. 2:18</u>, "For <u>through Him we both have access by</u> one Spirit to the Father."

### c. How long will we be "saved from the penalty of sin?" For how long is our justification valid?



### God, the perfect righteous Judge, made a judgment in His heavenly courtroom and declared that those who put their faith in Jesus are righteous because He has applied Jesus' perfect righteousness onto them.

God's decision on this is final, cannot be undone and there is no higher court to overturn this ruling.

<u>Heb. 10:11</u>, "And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins.

<u>Heb. 10:12</u>, "But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God,"
