



Background: God's Covenant with King David

- 1 Chron. 17:11, [God speaking to David] "'And it shall be, when your days are fulfilled, when you must go to be with your fathers, that I will set up your descendant after you, who will be of your sons; and I will establish his kingdom.
- 1 Chron. 17:12, "'He shall build Me a house, and I will establish his throne forever.
- 1Chron. 17:13, "'I will be his Father, and he shall be My son; and I will not take My mercy away from him, as I took it from him who was before you.
- 1 Chron. 17:14, "'And I will establish him in My house and in My kingdom forever; and his throne shall be established forever."

Psa. 2:2, "The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against His Messiah, saying,"

Psa. 2:6, "'Yet I have set My King on My holy hill of Zion.'
Psa. 2:7, "'I will declare the decree: The LORD has said to Me, "You are My Son, today I have begotten You."'


The Setting



Shekinah glory
"shakan" the dwelling
presence of God, often visible
as fire, or bright light.
The Christmas star was the
Shekinah glory.





Luke 2:10, "Then the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people.

Luke 2:11, "For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.

Luke 2:12, "And this will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger."

The Four Statements of the Angel

- 1. Do not be afraid.
- 2. I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people.
- 3. For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.
- 4. This will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger.

1. "Do not be afraid."

Used over 112× in the Bible, either as do not be afraid, or do not fear, or fear not.

Nearly always used at the time of a Divine or Angelic appearance (theophany or angelophany).

2. "I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to all people."

"good tidings" is the good news (εὖαγγελίζω *euaggelizō* "to proclaim good news"

"all people" – Luke uses this phrase almost exclusively to emphasize the people of Israel. It is not until later in Acts as the Church has begun and expanded to the Gentiles that it means more.

3. "For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

Savior: a term that most often refers to a deliverer from enemies: a judge, or general. Jehoahaz is the only king called a <u>soter</u>.

Soter has the idea of a rescuer or deliverer from peril, either spiritually or physically.

3. "For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

City of David reminds us of God's covenant with David, the promise of an eternal descendant, on an eternal throne, for an eternal kingdom. 3. "For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is <u>Christ</u> the Lord."

Christ: *Christos* (Gr.), translates *Meshiach* [מְשִׁיחֹ] in Hebrew; the anointed or appointed one. This is a technical term for the descendant of David.

Psa. 2:2, "The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against His Anointed [Meshiach], saying,"

3. "For there is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord."

Lord (κύριος): throughout the Old Testament this is the standard translation for *YHWH*, thus indicates the undiminished deity of the Messiah.

4. "This will be the sign to you: You will find a Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths, lying in a manger."

Luke 2:18, "And all those who heard it marveled at those things which were told them by the shepherds."




The Praise:

Luke 2:19, "But Mary kept all these things and pondered them in her heart.

Luke 2:20, "Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and

praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told them."



The Fifth Angelic Message: To Joseph: A warning

Matt. 2:13, "Now when they had departed, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream, saying, 'Arise, take the young Child and His mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I bring you word; for Herod will seek the young Child to destroy Him.'

Matt. 2:14, "When he arose, he took the young Child and His mother by night and departed for Egypt,

Matt. 2:15, "and was there until the death of Herod, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the Lord through the prophet, saying, 'Out of Egypt I called My Son.'"

The Sixth Angelic Message: To Joseph: Told to go home, a message of comfort

Matt. 2:19, "Now when Herod was dead, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt,

Matt. 2:20, "saying, 'Arise, take the young Child and His mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who sought the young Child's life are dead.'

Matt. 2:21, "Then he arose, took the young Child and His mother, and came into the land of Israel."

- Zechariah doubted, was disciplined;
- Mary trusted, but wanted to understand more about how she would become a mother;
- Joseph trusted and obeyed three times;
- The shepherds trusted, praised God, and told others.
